Climate challenges

Perhaps one of the most interesting aspects of the Lakeside series of hostas, was that they needed to withstand the humid, sub-tropical growing conditions found in Tennessee (click on map to view).

Lakeside Acres nursery was home to Mary and Roy Chastain and located to the east of Chattanooga in the far south-east of Tennessee. The nursery is now located in Michigan, read on to find out why...



There is an excellent transcribed interview, conducted in 2004 by Glen Williams, in the Reading Room of the **Hosta Library**, about Mary and Roy Chastain. We were very interested to discover just how many traits we found in common with their approach in enjoying working with their chosen genus. Although it is clear hybridising formed a large slice of that work, their interest began with a pure love of the plants. The frustration of being unable to source new varieties sparked their interest in hybridising. One of Mary's prime objectives, was to produce cultivars which could be more reliably grown in Tennessee gardens.



It is reassuring that so much effort has been taken to ensure their introductions should be garden worthy. Although we do not have the same climate as Tennessee, we are increasingly suffering more extremes of weather. Any varieties bred to withstand higher humidity should suit UK gardens.

All the plant elements have been re-organised into a single area, called the 'Grow' zone - click on the image to view:



As you can see, the Grow zone is north of the Long Water. If you are coming by car, this is where you will park to enter by the Stud Gate (Long Water) entrance.

The Plant Village, Floral Marquee and Plant Heritage Marquee will all be located here. The image below shows the position of the Plant Heritage Marquee within the Grow zone:
